#### 5.2. Administration

- 5.2.1. Follow up Action Report including;
  - a) Amendment of Bylaws
    - Remove amendment to bylaws at this time.
  - b) Schedule Commissioner Retreat Commissioner Bell will discuss with Commissioner Shook availability.
  - c) Land Altering Projects update
    - A three-hour tour of the island was made with Kat Ferneyhough, CRD Liaison.
    - There may be submissions in the fall from all Southern Gulf Islands for archaeological approval of routine maintenance. This affects CRD projects including leased land.
  - d) Assess/schedule Volunteer BBQ 2021 and responsibilities
    - With possible increase of Covid risk, invitations will be limited to current and fully vaccinated volunteers.
    - Proposed dates would be on Tuesday or Thursday during the second or third week of September.
    - Commissioner Bell will coordinate with the Lions Club.
  - e) Budget input for 2022 2026
    - There remain items on last year's capital budget and new item suggestions were requested.
    - Discussed Kippen Road staircase which will be followed up by Commissioner Askin.

- f) Sustainable Service Delivery Planning Committee.
  - CRD Finance will enquire on status, but issue seems separate from budgeting process.
  - The Committee will stand down.
- g) Williams Road and reparation
  - Remove item regarding contacting Ministry of Transportation.

#### 5.2.2.Insured asset replacement values

#### 5.2.3.SGI Active Transportation Network

Commissioner Euper attended the second meeting and reported that:

- Some trail mapping was completed;
- Watt Consulting met with CRD and will schedule a community engagement meeting in the fall;
- Coordination and governance were discussed. Proposed service delivery is by way of an Integrated Transportation Commission for three different travel modalities (trails, transit and water) with CRD providing support to the Commission and ensuring regulatory compliance;
- Maps for review were to be received and finalized by Labour Day weekend;
- This project would require a referendum; and
- The purpose of the project is to make inter-island travel accessible.

#### 5.3. Committees

#### 5.3.1. Sanitation

- a) Library water system update
  - The UV light may need replacement.
  - Pressure assisted toilets are not possible without major disruption to floors to relocate outflow pipe.
  - Discussed methods to track incidents to better understand the problem although no emergency call outs to Commissioner Shook have been received.
- b) Garbage/recycling station at Dinner Bay
  - A metal system is being considered for the station due to several issues including rodents.
  - This will be a capital project with cost up to \$2,000.

#### 5.3.2.Land Acquisition

• While some progress has been made with regards to the Bennett Bay property, it is necessary to first create the priority list.

#### 5.4. <u>Parks</u>

#### 5.4.1.Miners Bay

- Commissioner Wright will investigate the cost of shatter proof glass to replace windows at the library which have been chipped several times in the past.
- It was reported that malicious damage had been done to the first Earth Day planted apple tree and, while a product was used to fill in the gouge that was made, it is doubtful the tree will recover.
- Garden maintenance was discussed and Commissioner Wright will co-ordinate with volunteers and purchase a garden hose.
- It was reported that the bandstand repair may begin on Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### 5.4.2.Dinner Bay

- a) Volleyball/walking circuit update
  - The fitness circuit is under discussion with the Lions Club.
  - The volleyball equipment has arrived.
  - The First Nations review should have taken place although not yet confirmed
- b) Lions building license
  - A draft version of the license was received.
- c) Horseshoe pitch horse head sculpture
  - The sculpture was installed.
- d) Adachi Pavilion contents
  - Commissioner Bell will ensure basic kitchen utensils are purchased and broken pieces are discarded before the next scheduled event.
- e) Dog Sign transfer
  - Completed

#### 5.4.3.Japanese Garden

- Due to budget limit, a request was made for wood to replace the zigzag bridge at Japanese Garden.
- Advertising and donations have increased.

#### 5.4.4. Cotton Park

- No further information received on the First Nations recognition.
- Commissioner Bell will distribute and request comments before the next meeting on the draft Policy for Events which will be finalized in September.
- The property has officially been rezoned to Park.

  - The new flagpole is up and a picture was posted on Facebook.
  - Commissioner Bell will enquire with CRD regarding keeping the flag at halfmast.
