

## Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Southern Gulf Islands Community Economic Sustainability Commission Held September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 by Zoom

1. Approval of the Agenda – approved by consensus

- 2. Approval of Minutes July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Special Meeting adopted by consensus
- Financial Report was previously circulated.
  Commissioner Brent reported the budget is in good shape to the end of the year.

**MOVED** by Commission Hoebel, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Brent that the SGI CESC provisionally earmark \$2,500 for Rural Island Economic Partnership for the 2022 Economic Forum from the Program Development Fund from the 2022 budget. **CARRIED** 

The SGI CESC re-affirmed its approval to support a 2019 pledge to Southern Gulf Islands Tourism Partnership of \$2,000 for the Aqualink project.

The SGI CESC re-affirmed its approval to support a 2020 pledge to Rural Island Partnership of \$2,500 for the 2021 Virtual Economic forum.

- 4. Food and Ag update Ed Andrusiak
  - Ed shared an update on the Food Resilience Alliance
    - Projects are getting completed and good information is being gathered for the report.
    - Round tables have been well received and continue monthly. It consists of food and ag groups and they get together monthly and discuss specific topics.
       Next one is on hay. They will go to the end of the year
    - Equipment funding grant was submitted to Local Food Infrastructure Fund for \$30,600 and we need to wait for 100 days for an answer
    - Closing the supply gap, a CRD initiative demonstration project, broken into 3 subregions. Objective is to shorten the supply chain.

Commissioner Elliott relayed his thanks and appreciation for all the hard work of the Food Resilience Alliance and to Ed for taking the lead.

• Justine gave a brief review of Bylaw 4444 which has been previously distributed and the Bylaw is ready if the commission wishes to move forward with the recommendation.

## 7. New Business

- SGICRC Report on Community Sustainability project Allister Hain
  - First three months have been a learning curve.
  - He has been engaging with businesses and Chambers on various islands
  - Feedback received:
    - some businesses did well during COVID and increased their business and some were very challenged.
    - Regulations came up as a barrier for setting up a business.
    - Housing and labour are the biggest issues businesses face at the moment.
    - The ability to find competently trained businesses is also a challenge.
  - There was discussion on affordable housing and workforce housing in particular. As previously mentioned Justine will present a staff report at the next meeting.
- Commission Terms for Renewal
  - Two commissioners are up for renewal. Commissioner Elliott (Pender Island) will be stepping down by at the end of this year. Commissioner Goldman will let Melody know shortly if she is staying on for another term.
