"That the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission adopt the following local policy on its meetings, consistent with the CRD Procedures Bylaw 3828, Community Charter, and Local Government Act, to provide more detailed guidance for the planning, implementation, and reporting of Local Community Commission meetings. Pursuant to the LCC motion approved 22nd August 2023 that "the LCC hold one regular daytime meeting per month and one evening meeting per month," it shall be the policy of the LCC that those meetings be scheduled on a regular and predictable basis as follows:

- * The monthly evening meeting will be scheduled for 5:00PM on the 2nd Thursday of each month.
- * The monthly daytime meeting will be scheduled for 9:00AM on the 3rd Thursday of each month.

This meeting calendar will be effective as of the January 2024 LCC meetings. Meetings prior to that date shall adhere as closely as possible to this schedule as determined by the vote of the LCC.

Pursuant to the LCC motion approved 20th June, requesting "the Chair and Vice Chair to meet with staff to develop agendas and to participate in regular administrative briefings," those meetings will be scheduled by the Chair for the first Monday of the month at 10AM (the following Tuesday in the event of a statutory holiday) so as to allow adequate time to prepare, review, and post the meeting agendas. While the Chair retains the authority to change the date and time of the meeting due to circumstances, it should be used sparingly so as to not unduly limit the time available to all parties for their agenda preparation work.

Pursuant to section 12(1) of CRD Board Procedures Bylaw 3828, the agenda shall be prepared "under the direction of the Chair". A copy of the final agenda will be provided to the Chair and Vice-Chair by the end of business the Thursday preceding the meeting date for their review and approval. (By Friday if following a statutory Monday holiday). If approval of a final agenda duly provided has not been received by 8:00am on the Monday prior to the meeting, the agenda may be posted without Chair approval. Unless the preceding exception applies, an LCC meeting agenda shall not be publicly posted without prior approval of the Chair or Vice-Chair.

The draft minutes of each meeting shall be provided to the LCC Commissioners as soon as they are available but in no case later than one week following the second monthly meeting so that the Commissioners will have the opportunity to make corrections to the draft minutes prior to their release in the subsequent agenda package."]








Expenditure (2024)





Land Banking and Housing Outputs






CRHC 2023 Operations Budget

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THE CASE FOR GEOTUBES FOR SALT SPRING ISLAND

After talking to Kevin Bossy at Bishop Water Technologies, I feel that the LCC should seriously consider GeoTubes as a way to manage our Liquid Waste on Island. Many towns and cities across Canada and in BC are using this technology successfully, including Sechelt and Parksville.

If we compare GeoTubes to a Press there are several advantages:

- -much simpler and cheaper to install, run and maintain (note that ranking of options in the consultant report did not include installation costs)
- because of much lower up front costs and onsite storage for a period of years, the geotubes may not require borrowing (we could start with one tube and then expand the facility as we save the shipping fees we spend now)
- -doesn't need a building for the tubes and no storage needed for the solids (as they stay in the tube for 2 years or longer
- -decreased electricity use as it is primarily a passive process, materials are able to compost for longer
- -our Options Study suggested that the rubber tubes have to go to landfill, but they can be used for weed suppression, bank stabilization, road work or other uses

The company routinely does pilot studies when considering an installation. The first step is sending a pail of both the septage and the sewage for analysis to ensure the process will work and to determine. It's then possible to have an onsite demo with a small 2' x 2' tube and further examination and testing of the filtrate (liquid effluent) and the solid matter. Both of these steps can be done relatively quickly and for less than \$5000.

If there is still some doubt about the technology and our situation, there is a third step that includes a to-scale-model. This can be done for between \$10,000 and \$25,000 depending on the size of tube chosen.

SUBJECT 2024 Local Community Commission Budget Review

ISSUE SUMMARY

To present 2024 Local Community Commission (LCC) Budgets for recommended approval to the Capital Regional District Board (the Board).

BACKGROUND

New in 2023, the SSI Local Community Commission (LCC) was established towards the end of June. The CRD Board delegated administrative and advisory authority to the LCC for fourteen (14) existing SSI local services. This delegated authority includes review and recommendation of budgets annually.

Budgets for review are specific to 14 services under LCC delegated authority. The services delivered are established through the *Local Government Act and* Service Establishment Bylaws and are guided by the Board strategic and corporate plans.

Budget Approval Process

On September 14 and 21, 2023, the LCC met to review preliminary budgets. At these meetings, budget direction was provided where these impacts have been incorporated into the 2024 SSI provisional financial plan.

On October 25, 2023, the Board approved Provisional 2024-2028 Financial Plan, inclusive of SSI service budgets through Electoral Area Committee (EAC) and LCC recommendations.

The overall Salt Spring Island (SSI) 2024 provisional requisition increase is \$729,637 (9.56%) over 2023. This overall requisition increase of 9.56% is inclusive of SSI share of regional, subregional and joint EA services, and eighteen (18) SSI EA wide local services, but exclusive of specified and defined services within SSI. For reference, the overall 2024 SSI Provisional Plan are detailed in Appendix A outlining the requisition summary and gross expenditure highlights, which were obtained provisional approval by the Board on October 25, 2023.

Since provisional approval, changes to the plan have been incorporated to account for additional directions from LCC and available updated information. The changes to the Provisional Plan will form the proposed 2024 Final Plan. The changes are summarized in Appendix B outlining both requisition impacts and capital plan changes and further incorporated into the service budget packages in Appendix C.

The attached LCC 2024 budget packages in Appendix C, which include operating budgets and capital plans will be presented for final budget approval in March 2024 by the Board.

ALTERNATIVES

Alternative 1

That the Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional District Board: That the 2024 Local Community Commission 14 services budgets be approved as presented.

Alternative 2

That the Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional District Board: That the 2024 Local Community Commission 14 services budgets be approved with specific amendments.

The total requisition changes outlined in three tables above are further detailed by services in Appendix B.

The actual tax rate impact to SSI residents will vary depending on the specified and defined service areas in which they reside in addition to their individual 2024 property assessment values.

The 2024 provisional requisition impact shown in this report and appendices reflects the 2023 assessment values from BC Assessments. New assessment information will be incorporated in the final budget when revised data is released by BC Assessments in early February 2024.

CONCLUSION

The fourteen SSI services have been delegated to the LCC by the CRD Board for review and recommendation of budgets annually. The presented 2024 LCC services budgets have been prepared in alignment with service plans and directions received by the LCC and will form the 2024-2028 Final Financial Plan. The Final Financial Plan will be subject to change as a result of the final 2023 surplus/deficits, revised assessment information and any directed amendments prior to final approval by the Board as part of the Financial Plan bylaw by March 31, 2024.



SUBJECT 2024 Local Community Commission Administration Budget

ISSUE SUMMARY

To consider funding options to the 2024 Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission (LCC) Administration budget.

BACKGROUND

At the October 19, 2023, LCC meeting consideration of an additional full-time administrative support was deferred pending further information on the overall 2024 budget implications and details on the support role. At the same time, the LCC indicated they wished to attend future Union of British Columbia of Municipalities (UBCM) conferences.

To prepare for the establishment of the LCC, staff prepared a business case on the impact on services and governance, outlining the need for additional staff resource capacity to support administration and legislative services support of the LCC work. Staffing included one full-time support position for coordinating, booking, taking meeting minutes, supporting meeting agenda and report preparation and publication, and providing general support to the newly created elected body. This position will support the management team on various initiatives such as research and report writing, correspondence, bylaws, legislative processes, communication, consultation, and assist with project coordination management. The particulars relating to the position duties, roles, and responsibilities are delegated to the Chief Administrative Officer under the Capital Regional District's Officers', General Managers and Management Staff's Bylaw 3343.

The LCC has passed motions expressing their desire to hold additional meetings with no funding in place to support this request. Since the LCC inauguration, staff capacity has been consumed with requests for staff reports on various topics. To provide this level of service in providing professional advice to the LCC to make informed decisions, additional staff resources are required. The pace of decision-making should match the pace of operations based on available resources. Currently, there is not enough capacity to prepare reports and keep pace with the LCC decision-making process while maintaining a consistent level of service for the other seven local area service commissions and their associated services.

While the full-time administrative support to LCC has been removed from the 2024 provisional budget, staff have prepared three options for consideration in the final budget (Appendix A): (1) adding the administrative support, additional meetings (subject to negotiations), and funding for LCC to attend the annual UBCM conference; (2) funding for LCC to attend the annual UBCM conference only; and, (3) no changes to the 2024 provisional budget.

ALTERNATIVES

The Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional Board:

Alternative 1

To add funding to the 2024 Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission Administration budget for a full-time administrative support, additional meeting costs, and annual UBCM conference attendance costs.

Alternative 2

To add funding to the 2024 Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission Administration budget annual UBCM conference attendance costs.

Alternative 3

The Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission supports 2024 Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission Administration provisional budget.

IMPLICATIONS

Financial Implications

There has been added administration and legislative services support since the LCC was established. It was anticipated that some of the legislative and administration support costs would be offset by dissolving some of the existing Commissions, however, staff requested additional support for 2024 as it is expected that there will continue to be a significant increase in the activity of the LCC with respect to the additional number of other services included in their oversight.

Service Delivery Implications

Without the approval of additional administrative support for 2024 staff will continue to be challenged to meet current service levels and support LCC initiatives in a timely and professional manner.

CONCLUSION

The creation of a LCC for SSI was to permit greater elected representation for the EA and greater involvement in the administration of island-wide services, with the potential for elected members to advise on other on-island services or issues.

Since the inception of the LCC there has been a significant increase in the amount of staff time required to support the LCC impacting other services and staff's ability to meet competing demands and timelines.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional Board to add funding to the 2024 Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission Administration budget for a full-time administrative support, additional meeting costs, and annual UBCM conference attendance costs.

REPORT TO SALT SPRING ISLAND LOCAL COMMUNITY COMMISSION MEETING OF THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 23, 2023

SUBJECT Salt Spring Island Portlock Park Site Master Plan

<u>ISSUE</u>

To consider feedback received from community consultation on the three conceptual designs for the Portlock Park Site Master Plan.

BACKGROUND

The development of Portlock Park site master plan was identified as a priority in the 2019 Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Strategic Plan to enhance community use, develop additional ball fields and replace aging infrastructure in current or new locations. Relocating some of the park amenities from Portlock Park to the Rainbow Recreation Centre site will allow for more playing fields, specifically a senior sized baseball field for youth and adults on the Portlock site.

The master planning process assessed current and future capacity needs to identify opportunities to reconfigure the park to meet existing and future use. This plan will inform a phased capital planning approach for new park amenities based on inputs from key stakeholders, the general public and staff.

Staff and stakeholder workshops were organized in the Winter of 2023 followed by the first public survey that recorded 966 responses. Survey responses were presented to the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission (PARC) and incorporated into three draft conceptual designs. The draft conceptual designs were presented to the Local Community Commission (LCC) before being posted online and in the lobby of the Rainbow Recreation Centre and Salt Spring Island Multi Space (SIMS), along with a second survey to gather public feedback. The second round of public engagement has concluded with 910 responses. The feedback received has been integrated in the final master plan draft for LCC consideration. (Appendix A)

Feedback received is mixed between user groups with the removal of the oval track of particular concern. The addition of a senior ballfield and pickleball courts while retaining and relocating existing soccer and baseball fields is well supported. Public responses also showed support for Draft Option 1, however, the track has been removed from that option as both the track and a senior ballfield cannot both be located on the site.

To mitigate concerns that were heard regarding Draft Option 1, the plan has been revised to include: a connecting perimeter track, benches along the perimeter track, bleachers along the junior ballfield and relocating the new storage shed adjacent to the parking lot.

Once approved, the final draft plan along with the final report will be shared with stakeholders and the Salt Spring community through email, online posting and display at the Rainbow Recreation Centre lobby and SIMS to gather final thoughts.

<u>ALTERNATIVES</u>

CONCLUSION

Following nine months of consultation including stakeholder workshops, two community surveys and input from CRD parks staff, PARC and the LCC one Draft Master Plan has been developed for final consideration. Several comments have been received requesting that the oval track be included in the final master plan. The Draft Master Plan Option 1 received the most support from survey respondents but does not include an oval track. A connecting perimeter track has been added to Draft Master Plan Option 1 to mitigate concerns with the track removal.

That the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission approves the draft Portlock Park Site Master Plan as presented in Appendix A.



We can't afford to lose Portlock for 8 months while you get us %10 more capacity there. Soccer is THE sport here. I won the Western Canadian Baseball Champions for Bantam and coach soccer here on SSI now, and so I can tell you that soccer gets played at least 10x more than Baseball. Baseball has all the capacity it needs on the island, with it's field used about %15 of the time (they hardly ever use their batting cage). Soccer is happening everyday all year on most every field, from SSE elementary to Hydro field to the High School field to Portlock. SSI has produced two National team soccer players. The elementary school field is a horrible divot and dust boll because the kids play SO much soccer everyday schools in. Soccer is the thing that provides real community health and unity across all cultures and immigrants' integration with the community... Baseball doesn't touch it, it provides almost no cardio and is pretty well only for white people (I'm 7th generation white canadian)... But you'll take out %60 of the space that soccer happens in for 8 months without giving us an artificial turf pitch for it?!!? Are you insane!? Soccer is the last international peace movement and keeps the already overstretched hospital barely operational... Without soccer for 8 months the community will collapse in so many ways. That's why most of us (dozens I've heard from - and no, it wasn't me broaching and framing it, it was others broaching it) don't want any of these options you've provided. A midwife friend of mine crunched the demography of Salt Spring and there are at least 27,000 people here now (people aren't

reporting to the census that they have 2-5 RV trailers rented out on their properties). So we need turf fields that don't get destroyed by use in and after rains, we can't afford the down time of the fields. Just look at how Thriftys and Country Grocer are chocker block full of shoppers all the time, and that tells you all you need to know about population intensity here. In business school they teach how much population a single grocer needs to support it and these 2 full service grocers are clearly benefiting from year round populations at more like 35,000-45,000 people - the roads are constantly full of traffic, like a lower mainland suburb. We need the high school field turned into a turf pitch and the current full sized pitch at Portlock turned into a turf pitch... The high school pitch is all fill and sand so it can't be watered to keep the grasses up through the summer, and so it's a totally unreliable field that can't support any intensity of use... Two major turf pitches and then we might have enough capacity moving forward... But right now our kids are sacrificing serious training days (about %10-20 of practices and games get canceled so we don't destroy the fields) to keep the current fields usable. The CRD and us coaches do a good job of maintaining our grass fields, but it comes at serious self-sacrifice for the kids' training, kids who are obsessed with getting better, and the biggest limitation to these kids is having to baby and recondition the grass from soccer, Baseball hardly impacts their field, but you're going to triple baseballs' capacity!? Kids who play summer baseball sulk when they're at Portlock having to play baseball away from their friends having a kick around of a soccer ball on the other side of the field while the baseball game is on... I've seen it multiple times. Plus the hospital and first responders need to stop using the field for the air ambulance and driving out onto the grass, if it's artificial turf, maybe they can land and drive heavy vehicles on it. But now we can't even afford the community not exercising via soccer and the track for the sake of the helicopter to take up the space landing and taking off.

I'm so disappointed for several reasons, and the loss of the tennis courts is a huge carrier for me in being for any of these designs. It is incredibly sad that it is somehow rationalized to be okay with removing and wasting a community asset paid for by tax dollars and private donations, when another group demands their own interests louder-and that these demands are catered to. Tennis is an excellent lifetime sport and it is has been very poorly supported by the CRD on Salt Spring for the 20 years we've lived here. The tennis association took it upon themselves to build the indoor courts in large part because of this lack of investment. The poor of upkeep and inadequate investment in these courts is evident as the disrepair grows along with the grass and cracks in the surface, and is a detriment to the the health of the sport on Salt Spring; as well as an embarrassment for Salt Spring to the many visitors who use them. Apparently the courts are being relocated to Rainbow Road. I have not seen a plan or specific timeline for project completion - not to say it doesn't exist, but to truly make an informed decision, those plans and timelines should

have been available alongside this feedback so them public can review both alongside each other. This whole process has been disappointing and appears poorly managed. Nonetheless, so my voice isn't lost or discarded for not choosing an option, I choose draft Option 3 because it keeps the track (although there are still problems with this draft design). There are many people of all abilities that use this track on a daily basis. I am at the park frequently, and witness it's use (and I have photos documenting this use) by seniors using it with and without mobility aides because it is wide and level, to parents walking their kids in strollers, to kids learning to ride their bike, to people using it to rehab after injury or surgery, to avid walkers and competitive runners; and as you know, the annual school events. To even consider removing this heavily-used community asset would impact the health of many. Not everyone can access Salt Spring's walking/hiking trails, but the track is accessible to almost everyone. Has there been a good audit of the park usage, and specifically the track, to create some data? Who uses it when and for what? Because I'm having a very hard time understanding how PARC/the CRD/the LCC could consider removing an asset like the track (and as I've said above, let alone the tennis courts, which is another fiasco) when its usage is high. Baseball fields are used for a specific purpose and for a relatively short season and I frankly don't understand why they are getting such a relative centre stage (no offence ball lovers, and my family plays and has played their share of baseball and softball); whereas, the track is usable year round by many, no one has to pay out of pocket, need special equipment, or sign up - it's just there all the time. The role of the PARC and CRD should be about the health of the whole, not only a loud group that demands their needs be met and the rest of do without. Please don't take out the track. I can't say this enough. Draft option 1's path options are guite terrible to be frank. I'd be very concerned for people to be walking and running right next to the soccer field at such a close range while it's in use if this option is chosen. My kids have played, coached, and refereed soccer for over 20 years on SSI, and people could get quite injured at soccer balls flying at them at close range especially if they aren't paying attention. I have seen spectators take a ball in the head when they weren't looking, and spectators (most often) are paying attention, but walkers/path users would not be expected to be paying attention (I have to wonder if you consulted the soccer club about this idea and what their thoughts are about the safety). The narrower path away from the soccer field is just that - too narrow. You wouldn't be able to walk side by side if people are going the opposite way, so it would be a difficult activity to do with others, it would be hard to pass people going in the opposite direction, and I wonder about the visibility and safety being at the perimeter (seniors falling, etc). This option is just an absolute no from a track/path/trail stand point. Draft option 2's walking path is much better than option 1, but I still have concerns. 1) The draft doesn't show how the loop is connected; 2) it doesn't

explain the surface of the path; 3) I have concerns about visibility with it being right close to the perimeter of the park where not everyone would be comfortable with that. Would it be lit? The "preferred" court sizes are significantly larger as set by the American Pickleball Association and include space for seating and congregating while waiting for your next turn. Again, refer to new courts in Mill Bay and Cowichan. Many short games are played in a two hour session. The turn over needs to be efficient. If CRD/Parc were to go ahead with the minimum court size, there would have to be space designated for the 20 or so players who we expect to be using this facility at any one time to sit and congregate.

When studying the 3 Options, I see what I perceive to be an underlying problem that cannot be resolved by any configuration of components within the boundaries of Portlock Park. The park is not large enough to accommodate all the needs that have been identified. None of these 3 Options is free of substantial compromise (ie a compromise with a negative impact on some demographic of park users). According to Options 1 and 2, track runners are non-existent (Option 1 No.7). A 3m wide rectangular track is no more constitutes a track than a patch of field with a pitchers mound and a rectangle does a baseball diamond. Option 2 has several overlapping fields, the effect of which I have no capacity to judge, however, it must be a compromise that affects both soccer and baseball players. Option 3 has a track which appears to be the same as current track one, relocated, as no straight end is shown and no other details are provided. Option 3 compromises the enjoyment and safety of runners and walkers, especially elderly and infirm walkers, by continuing to requiring all of them to share the track. None of the 3 Option addresses the need for a safe and separate place for small children to practise riding their bicycles. Given that these three Options are designed to fulfil the outcomes of the 20 year plan, I am most concerned that certain sports and recreational activities currently facilitated at Portlock Park are conspicuous by their exclusion and/or minimal inclusion in the three Options. This appears to imply that planning is biased towards sports that are trending, or being played by the most people right now, as opposed to addressing the broad base of recreational and sporting needs of all of our community's active participants. Let us plan effectively and spend our tax dollars wisely, for short and long term benefits for all.

Aug 18: "We have called upon you to complete the Portlock Park master plan survey. Now we are calling on you to attend the next Local Community Commission meeting, Tuesday August 22nd, 9:00 AM in the Salt Spring Middle School Boardroom. Early word is that we are already experiencing pushback and resistance to change at Portlock Park. Based on the fact the survey doesn't close until August 21st, this is coming from somewhere else. Dear Mr. Ovington and Mr. Webster,

I am writing for the Salt Spring Sneakers Running Club as their coach and representative.

Most of our membership has responded to the current survey that provides a model of three possible site reconstruction options for Portlock Park. As a running and walking group, our primary concern is the 400m track and the potential loss of this vital feature used by many community members, not just the Sneakers.

You have received other letters of concern regarding the shape of the track, which for correct training and competition, must remain an oval, based on IAAF (International Association of Athletics Federations) standards. While slight reconfigurations are possible, please see the attached link for measurements used worldwide for all levels of competition up to and including the Olympics.

A rectangle, as proposed in the CRD's "Option 1," is inappropriate for training runners and potentially dangerous regarding negotiating tighter turns if runners, walkers, older adults, and children on bikes are on the track simultaneously, as often occurs. An incomplete "walk/jog" track (Option 2) also negates the sport-specific training protocols for running sports, which make clear distinctions between the terms "running" and "jogging." The jog is a reference pace generally used for warming up and cooling down.

A standard track does, in fact, allow for multi-sport fields to be included in the center. The other options would negate the possibility of training youth or masters (ages 35+) running teams and individuals, which would be a shame as talented runners on Salt Spring train and compete year-round.

Please consider the implications of removing and replacing the oval with non-standardized options for the sake of the island's current and future track athletes.

Hi Dan,

I am writing to you as the Physical Education specialist teacher at Salt Spring Elementary School, an athletic coach, past Kinesiology major (SFU 2013-2015), and marathon runner, to give criticism on the current Portlock Park Master Plans. From my experience and area of study, I argue that of the 3 proposed options the CRD provided, options 1 and 2, which include the removal of the Portlock Park track, will negatively impact the greater community of Salt Spring Island.

The initial criticism I have is the priority the first two options give to an already established sport (baseball) while further limiting other athletic options within our community. A notable challenge within our community is the lack of diversity of extracurricular or athletic options for the younger demographics. There are few sports that are strongly established for youth in our community, one of them being baseball. While there is a lack of senior ball fields on the island, baseball as a demographic, is a relatively limited group to be prioritized, due to its seasonal schedule (April to August). Additionally, this benefitting group is further limited as it is focused on the development of a senior ball field, only benefitting players 13 years+ (a much smaller population). Athletics Canada's 'Long Term Athlete Development' model states that children should be participating in multiple sports up to the ages of 15 (female) and 16 (male). The removal of the track and addition of a senior ball field, will both further limit the opportunity of varying sports on the island, while prioritizing earlier specialization for younger demographics.

Further to extracurricular impacts, this directly affects the elementary school communities' athletics. A highlight of the school year is the Elementary Track and Field Meet. As the SSE Phys-Ed specialist, we approach track and field as a 5-6 week unit focusing on a variety of athletic skills and movements. All grade 4-7 students take part in two separate meets, which will likely see around 250 students compete. This is a significant part of the school year, and is a highlight as track and field is arguably the most inclusive sport that children can participate in. I remember my elementary track meets fondly, and recognise those events personally led me to compete in track and field throughout high school. I recently had a number of parents reach out to me regarding this, one of them quoting from the CRD that in the case the track is removed, we can paint a track onto the field. Speaking from my specialty and experience of coaching track and field on a painted field last year, this will not be a suitable substitute for a competition situation. Unfortunately, I suspect if the track is removed, the track and field meet may not continue.

Lastly, through observation, the Portlock track appears to be the most consistently used amenity in the park. It is used by a wide range of people including school children, senior community members, specially abled people, runners, and people focusing on healthy lifestyles. As a marathon runner, and a person who frequently uses the track, the alternative placement of a 300 M square walking track in option 1 does not benefit this community as a suitable replacement. In option 2, there does not seem to be any substitution at all, which seems strange considering the track is frequently utilized by specially abled or senior members of the community who need a space for exercise and physical literacy.

When considering these points, and after reading the Salt Spring Parks and Rec strategic plan (2019), there seems to be notable contradictions between their mission statement, and approach. I have noted these below, along with the initial Mission Statement.

5.1. MISSION

The mission of the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission is to:

Provide access to quality, safe, diverse, year-round, and inclusive parks, recreation and sport facilities, trails and water access, and to deliver recreational programs that enhance quality of life, promote healthy lifestyles, strengthen the sense of community, and connect all residents and visitors with nature, while following environmental best practices.

"5.2. DESIRED OUTCOMES

We believe that parks and recreation are a means to an end. They are purposeful tools used to address a variety of individual, social, ecological, and economic issues. By providing a quality parks and recreation system, we will work to achieve the following outcomes:

Healthy active lifestyle for all"

Two of the three options provided by the CRD prioritize specialized athletic performance for a small demographic, rather then "healthy active lifestyle for all".

"5 3 2 PRIORITY MARKETS"

"PARC can't be all things, to all people, all the time, so we need to prioritize how and where the CRD's finite resources are expended. Prioritizing requires us to be deliberate about what programs or facilities are offered as well as the market segments we are focused on.

Moving forward, emphasis will be made on ensuring decisions about parks and recreation will, directly and indirectly, benefit the greatest number of residents in the following priority markets:

- Seniors—we know that physical inactivity is leading to significant individual and social costs.
- Children and Youth—we know that an early start at a healthy lifestyle is likely to last a
 lifetime and that leisure education and developing a strong leisure repertoire at a young
 age is critical to enabling lifelong participation.
- Isolated and Vulnerable Populations—we know these populations tend to face barriers that can reduce or prevent participation, which leads to growing individual and social issues."

Rather than focusing on these populations, the priority is rather set towards a small demographic which benefits from an organized voice.


"6.1. PROVIDE A DIVERSE MIX OF OUTDOOR ATHLETIC FACILITIES"


The stated options 1 and 2 are rather reducing diversity of outdoor athletic fields.


"8.3. MINIMIZE BARRIERS TO PARTICIPATION"



The proposed plans focusing on developing a senior ball field are reducing potential alternative options to baseball, which rather is creating further barriers to people of varying 'age, income, ethnicity, or physical disability.'

SUBJECT Salt Spring Island Hydro-Field Upgrades

ISSUE

To provide an update to the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission on the Hydro-Field upgrades project.

BACKGROUND

One of the strategies in the 2019 Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Strategic Plan is to "Partner with School District 64 to upgrade and utilize existing playing fields and to develop additional sports fields." This strategy has been prioritized following a donation of \$300,000 that has been secured specifically to upgrade the School District (SD64) owned Hydro-Field baseball diamond to support girls fastpitch and other baseball groups.

The Hydro-Field is centrally located at 160 Rainbow Road adjacent to the SD64 works yard, Salt Spring Island Multi Space (SIMS) and Salt Spring Island Elementary. The field has lighting and is currently used for school board activities, baseball, soccer and occasionally, special events such as the Salt Spring Island Show and Shine. The current field lacks a formal baseball and soccer field, drainage and requirements for spectators, coaches or athletes.

A conceptual plan has been developed (Appendix 1) with a goal of creating two softball diamonds on the Hydro-Field while retaining the soccer field in the middle. One of the fields would be regulation size with the second smaller field being used for junior play and practice. Installing drainage on the field would allow for more use by students, soccer and baseball during the wetter months.

An additional \$50,000 of reserve funding was allocated towards this project to complete initial assessments, class D cost estimates and project management. Initial cost estimates to complete all works came in at \$2,438,400, well above the \$350,000 project budget. Without additional funding, the scope of the project has been reduced to focus on the ballfield as that was the intent of the donation:

- A raised ballfield elevation with sand to level and improve drainage.
- Relocate and replace existing ballfield backstop and fencing.
- New dugouts and adjacent storage shed with concrete block pony walls and metal roof.
- Hydroseeded turf outfield
- New baseball fly netting to existing backstop and upgrade footings for required structural support.

Additional works identified in the conceptual plan may be completed later if funding is secured.

<u>IMPLICATIONS</u>

Financial Implications

The 2022 Pool and Park Land Combined Capital Reserve Fund (CRF) had allocated funding towards the development of additional sports fields on Salt Spring Island. It was assumed that a portion of this funding would be used for detailed designs and cost estimates to upgrade the playing fields at Fernwood Elementary however, this project was put on hold and \$50,000 of CRF was allocated towards the Hydro-Field Upgrade Project. An additional \$300,000 donation has been secured bringing the total project budget to \$350,000.

CONCLUSION

A donation has been received to fund upgrades to the SD64 owned Hydro-Field. Conceptual plans and cost estimates have been developed to determine the scope of the phase one of the project based on existing funding.



<u>SUBJECT</u> Salt Spring Island Public Library Archives Climate Control System Replacement

ISSUE

To seek approval to add the design, supply, installation and commissioning of a replacement climate control system in the Salt Spring Island Public Library archives vault to the 2024 Library Five Year Capital Plan

BACKGROUND

This project will replace critically important heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) equipment which controls temperature and humidity inside the archive vault at the Salt Spring Island Public Library. The library provides a fundamentally important service to the residents of Salt Spring Island, as well as many visitors. The books, documents, papers and other items contained in the vault are historically significant and in order to properly protect and preserve them, the HVAC system must be replaced. Pre-screening for the Community Works Fund grant has already been completed, submitted and approved for this project and competitive quotes for the work from qualified contractors have been obtained. There are adequate funds in the Capital Reserve Fund for 2024 (\$86,355) to fund this project.

ALTERNATIVES

Alternative 1

That the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional District Board:

To add the Salt Spring Island Library Archives Climate Control System Replacement project in the amount of \$80,000 to the 2024-2028 Five Year Capital Plan.

Alternative 2

That this report be referred back to staff for additional information.

IMPLICATIONS

Alternative 1

This project will replace critically important HVAC equipment which controls temperature and humidity inside the archive vault at the Salt Spring Island Public Library. The current system is failing and exposing the vault's contents to potentially damaging humidity and temperature fluctuations. The books, documents, papers and other items contained in the vault are historically significant and in order to properly protect and preserve them, the HVAC system must be replaced. The total project budget is \$80,000, funded by \$10,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund and \$70,000 from the Community Works Fund.

Alternative 2

A request for further information will delay the project and risk that the historical books, documents and papers contained in the vault will be damaged or subject to accelerated deterioration.

CONCLUSION

The CRD supports a number of libraries throughout the Southern Gulf Islands and provides a fundamentally important service to the residents of Salt Spring Island, as well as many visitors. This project will ensure that historically significant books, documents, papers and other items are appropriately stored, preserved and protected.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission recommends to the Capital Regional District Board:

To add the Salt Spring Island Library Archives Climate Control System Replacement project in the amount of \$80,000 to the 2024-2028 Five Year Capital Plan.

SUBJECT Delegation Bylaw and Procurement Policy

ISSUE SUMMARY

To review the Capital Regional District (CRD) delegation powers and procurement policy.

BACKGROUND

On October 19, 2023, the Local Community Commission (LCC) adopted a motion to augment the CRD procurement policy by requiring staff to provide advanced notice, up to seven days, of plans to post, repost, or cancel public procurement relating to any LCC service. The motion read:

That the Local Community Commission request staff to provide the LCC with information where possible seven days advanced notice of plans to post, repost, or cancel public procurement relating to any LCC service.

Excepting certain non-competitive purchases, all opportunities estimated at more than \$75,000 for goods and services, and \$200,000 for construction, must be posted to BCBid.ca, the Provincial purchasing website of record. Opportunities are also posted on CRD's business opportunities website. No registration is required to view opportunities, and individuals may sign-up for notifications of new opportunities and changes by e-mail. All awards over the threshold amounts are required to have successful vendor name and award amount posted to BCBid.ca within 72 days of the date of award. Smaller opportunities may be posted but are typically sourced informally.

The LCC is engaged in purchasing in the following ways:

- Through the annual budgeting process, the LCC recommends the Board approve a financial plan, including capital plans. This provides high-level direction on service priorities, procurement needs, and upcoming capital expenditures.
- The LCC recommends sources of funding for projects and operational procurements through the financial plan approval process and related loan authorization and security issuing bylaw approvals and processes.
- The LCC receives quarterly project tracker reports summarising actions taken to date and work completed in advancing LCC priorities as outlined in the financial plan and service requests.
- Staff report to the LCC financial implications when bids, tenders, or proposals are over the budget limits in the approved financial plan. At that time, the LCC provides direction on approving spending limits, funding sources, delaying, or cancelling projects.
- The procurements are conducted in accordance with the CRD Procurement Policy.

The CRD's procurement policy is aligned with the Auditor General Local Government's findings in the "Improving Local Government Procurement Processes Through: Procurement Policy

Enhancements, Procurement Performance Metrics and Reporting, and Vendor Performance Management" (January 2016).

While the LCC may set project priorities and advise on budget, including providing advice on initial plans and processes, it has no delegated transactional authority to make a purchase and may not direct changes to the CRD's purchasing process, per CRD Bylaws No. 4186, "Capital Regional District Delegation Bylaw No. 1, 2017" (the "Delegation Bylaw"). The Delegation Bylaw delegates the authority to staff to conduct purchasing without Board or Commission approval up to certain threshold values, provided it is done so in accordance with the process set out in the CRD Procurement Policy.

IMPLICATIONS

Alignment with Existing Plans & Strategies

The CRD Procurement Policy creates a decentralized procurement system and sets out how purchases occur. It ensures provincial trade agreement obligations and best practices are met when purchasing. The decentralized purchasing model makes staff in operating departments and divisions responsible for purchasing.

Under Bylaw No. 4186, "Capital Regional District Delegation Bylaw No. 1, 2017", purchasing transactional authority is delegated to officers, employees, and volunteers. Purchases must be done in accordance with the Procurement Policy and included in the approved annual financial plan.

This approach supports good government procurement practices:

- Assign procurement responsibility to professional and experienced staff who are accountable for fiduciary and legal procurement duties;
- ensuring that the integrity of the CRD's procurement system remains apolitical;
- reducing direct or implied pressure on staff in the performance of their procurement duties;
- protecting elected members from consultants, prospective proponents, or agents trying to intervene or discuss procurement proceedings;
- avoid events or interactions in any public or private forum that may circumvent delegated authority and procurement policy;
- Eliminate any public perception of conflict of interests about any business relationship between an elected official and the CRD;

Financial Implications. Financial Risk, and Personal Risk

Adding a requirement specific to alerting the LCC will lead to delays and increased administrative costs. For example, briefing information will need to be provided; budget information may be disclosed in an open forum, which may result in all quotes arriving skewed; or commissioners may express a preference for one or more local buyers in open meeting which may have an effect on bidders, lead to costly disputes from unsuccessful bidders, or render potential vendors ineligible from opportunities as a result.

The greatest risk is commercial litigation arising from non-compliant purchasing. In accordance with the *Local Government Act*, all legal fees and expenses are paid by the specific service associated with incurring those fees. Non-compliance with procurement policies that lead to

litigated matters would expose the small local services that LCC is responsible for to significant costs and expenses, which the ratepayers would be wholly responsible for.

Political involvement in the procurement process raises the risk that individual commissioners might inadvertently act outside their authority, such as intervening in a procurement process, creating opportunities for certain vendors to have advantage over others, or making representations relied on by potential vendors, that could result in claims brought against them in their personal capacity. These claims may not be defended or indemnified under the *Local Government Act*, which only covers claims where commissioners are acting within the scope of their authority. Staff with clear Board-delegated responsibility for this role have immunity to such claims.

In addition, business opportunities above the treaty threshold amounts specifically include "no lobbying" clauses, which renders vendors who approach individuals other than the purchaser ineligible from competition. This is often a requirement of projects funded by grants and forms part of most CRD corporate purchasing templates. What may occur if commissioners are approached and lobbied is a loss of opportunity for a potential vendor.

Service Delivery Implications

Specific to the LCC's request, providing specific notice of a posting or change to a public procurement opportunity interferes with the authority that the Board has chosen to delegate to staff. Sometimes purchases will need to be conducted quickly to comply with emerging circumstances, grant opportunities or collaboration with other groups. Creating additional steps in the procurement process or approvals outside of the CRD's Procurement Policy is outside of the LCC's authority. Requesting the Board incorporate this change into the CRD's Delegation Bylaw and Procurement Policy for LCC services is not advisable as it may create inefficiencies in service delivery and introduce the risk of political interference in the purchasing process. The appropriate time for commissioners to influence the procurement process is at the time of project and financial plan approval, where specific requirements or preferences can be discussed.

CONCLUSION

The CRD's procurement process incorporates industry best practices to be carried out by trained staff. Responsible staff engage in ongoing procurement training to understand the complexities, risks, issues that arise between the CRD and vendors. CRD staff have Board-delegated authority to carry out purchasing up to specified values in accordance with approved policies and procedures, without the need for additional guidance, approval or notification to elected officials. Adding addition requirements to the procurement process is potentially inefficient and not compliant with the CRD's Delegation Bylaw or Procurement Policy.

RECOMMENDATION

There is no recommendation. This report is for information only.

SUBJECT 2024 Schedule of Regular Local Community Commission Meetings

<u>ISSUE</u>

To review the 2024 meeting schedule for the Salt Spring Island Local Community Commission.

BACKGROUND

Staff had originally proposed a monthly meeting schedule for the Salt Spring Island (SSI) Local Community Commission (LCC) to be held on the third Tuesday at 9:00 am. The only exception is the September meeting to be held a week later (Sept. 24), to avoid conflict with Union of British Columbia of Municipalities (UBCM) conference held September 16-20, subject to budget approval. It was determined that this day of the week would minimize conflicts with other local agency meeting schedules as well as weekly staff commitments for both local SSI CRD Administration staff and CRD staff working out of CRD head office.

The LCC passed a motion on July 18th, 2023 to direct staff that monthly meeting be held on the third Thursday of each month. In addition, the LCC passed a motion on August 22nd, 2023 directing staff to hold a second monthly meeting in the evening.

Holding meetings on Thursday created a conflict with prescheduled SSI Local Trust Committee (LTC) meetings and a town hall meeting held by the Salt Spring Fire and Rescue. Setting an annual schedule for LCC meetings well in advance will allow staff to mitigate potential conflicts moving forward.

When determining monthly meeting schedules the LCC should note:

Local Agency	Meeting Schedule	
SSI Fire and Rescue Trustees	Meetings are typically held on the third Monday of each month.	
SD64 School Board Trustees	Meetings are typically held on the second Wednesday of each month.	
SSI Rotary Club	Meeting are held weekly on Wednesdays	
North Salt Spring Water Works	Meetings are typically held on the fourth Thursday of the month.	
SSI Local Trust Committee	Meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month except for when there is a statutory holiday which can cause the meeting date to move by a week in either direction.	
SSI Lions Club	Meeting are held every second and fourth Thursday of the month in the evenings	
CRD Board / CRD Electoral Area Committee	Meetings are typically held on the second Wednesday of each month.	

Staff are again proposing that LCC meetings be scheduled on the third Tuesday of each month (Appendix A). The proposed schedule:

- Minimizes conflicts with other agency meetings
- Minimized schedule conflicts for CRD staff
- Allows time to prepare and issue media releases
- Enable staff to respond to questions from local media prior to publication
 - Correct misinformation
 - o Edit, review, or provide comments
 - Provide photos or supporting information
- The local media can still post their reporting of LCC meetings on their website

Consideration of a second monthly LCC meeting held in the evening is contingent on additional staff support and union negotiations.

ALTERNATIVES

Alternative 1

That the regular meetings for the Local Community Commission will be scheduled in 2024 on the third Tuesday of each month as follows: January 16, February 20, March 19, April 16, May 21, June 18, July 16, August 20 (at the call of the Chair), September 24, October 15, November 19, and December 10 (at the call of the Chair).

Alternative 2

That this report be referred back to staff for additional information.

CONCLUSION

Holding SSI LCC meetings on Thursdays has created a conflict with other local community agencies' regularly scheduled meetings and CRD staff commitments. Holding meetings on Tuesdays appears to not have any conflicts with other local agencies and improves the availability of other CRD staff to attend if needed.

RECOMMENDATION

That the regular meetings for the Local Community Commission will be scheduled in 2024 on the third Tuesday of each month as follows: January 16, February 20, March 19, April 16, May 21, June 18, July 16, August 20 (at the call of the Chair), September 24, October 15, November 19, and December 10 (at the call of the Chair).
