#### 5.1. Treasurer's Reports

#### 5.2. Administration

#### 5.2.1. Follow up Action Report (not covered elsewhere)

- a) Calendar items: Volunteer appreciation barbecue, capital plan budget and recreational funding.
- b) Civic addresses for parks: Blue address signs will be ordered and installed at main park entrances.
- c) New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP): The seniors fitness program is going well and new posters will reference NHSP support and logos.
- d) Holiday tree lights: To meet the requirements for SGI Electrical Services to install GFI breakers in the library basement, Commissioners Kilpatrick and Banelis will design and build a waterproof box to replace the box currently on the tree and chain will be used to secure the box in place.
- e) Lions request for use of Miners Bay Park: This item to be removed from the Follow-up Report.
- f) Felix Jack Park: Discussed grass mowing for accessibility to some areas and for fire prevention purposes as well as keeping grass longer in some areas for aesthetics and moisture retention at the base. Recommend the park be fully mowed in the fall to manage invasive weed seeds.
- g) Trail development between Laura Pt and Neill Rd: Commissioner Kilpatrick will discuss this project with Irene Barrett, Mayne Island Pathways and Trails Association.

- Discussion occurred regarding the use of playground equipment by adults which risks injury and causes maintenance issues.
- Signage was discussed.

- b) ParticipACTION: Park use entries during the last two weeks of June showed Kim Road Park received the most entries and Cotton Park was second. There were a few entries at Henderson Hill and Dinner Bay Park and there were over 500 entries recorded.
- c) Volunteer BBQ: Commissioners were asked to send their volunteer invitation list to Commissioner Bell. General information will be published in the MayneLiner. Refreshments and flowers were confirmed. The Bistro is calculating their price for 80 people and tables and chairs will be arranged with the Lions Club.

## **Fred and Bette Cotton Park Report**

#### 11 August, 2025

- The sign acknowledging First Nations is installed and prominently displayed with the Fred and Bette Cotton Park sign. That sign has been cleaned and several coats of finish applied.
- The driveway starting from the bollards to the gardens has been graded with the tractor and grass raked out. A huge thank you to Commissioners Wright and Kilpatrick for this major improvement.
- Choisya hedge pruned thanks to Mitch B. and Steve M.
- Driveway garden very dry and watering limited due to supply issues.
- Contacted CRD regarding site visit by archaeologist and perhaps cultural monitor this summer.

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# **Henderson Park Report August 2025**

- Trails are generally in good condition thank you to trail guardians.
- Fir trees obscuring the Kiosk at trailhead have been trimmed/ removed
- Some obsolete signage at the Trailhead has been removed and consolidated
- Drafting of new content for trailhead kiosk is continuing. Draft content for the Interpretive trail has been provided by the Conservancy and expects the new map to be ready by the end of August. Accompanying photos for "thumbnails" are also under review. Other content has been drafted.
- "Problem Arbutus Tree" at junction of Doreen Mcleod trail has been removed.



### **Japanese Memorial Garden**

#### 10 August, 2025

- 1.) No date has been set yet for the installation of the refurbished Torii gates. We are waiting to "git-erdone".
- 2.) Work continues on the repairs to the north fence panels.
- 3.) The water levels in the pond have dropped to the point where the main waterfall was turned off on Friday August 8<sup>th</sup>.
- 4.) Due to the extremely low water levels in the pond the JMG volunteers are investigating ways of:
  - a. Deepening the pond in the area of the two pumps and,
  - b. Looking at ways of stabilizing and beautifying the shoulders of the island that become exposed when the water levels drop.
  - c. Removing the built-up layer of decomposing organics which is approximately 8" of material. This layer also harbours the root mass of the invasive waterlily.
    - i. We are looking at possibly using a lowboy hydrovac truck to do this work.

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
