08 September, 2025

- Gardens and grounds given final touch ups for wedding held on September 6, 2025. Thank you to Fay R. and Gareth G.
- Park left in pristine condition and no concerns regarding event which bodes well for moving from a pilot project for events to a final policy.
- Caterpillar nests removed from walnut tree which has many walnuts this year and deposited in Active Pass. No other nests observed.
- Gate to Circle Garden left open apparently due to failing latch. Fortunately, deer did not discover what would have been an amazing buffet. Latch has been repaired – thank you to Jon S.
- Meeting with Commissioner Legge scheduled for September 10, 2025 to review signage.
- One low hanging cedar branch on section of trail near parking lot should be removed. Discuss with Commissioner Wright.



Henderson Park Report August 2025

- Trails are generally in good condition thank you to trail guardians.
- Commissioners Wright & Legge replaced some rotted wooden steps on Vulture ridge trail. Another approx 10 steps are in poor condition and will need replaced.
- Following with Conservancy for revised trail map and once received should have a final draft of content for trailhead kiosk.



Japanese Memorial Garden

7 September, 2025

- 1.) No date has been set yet for the installation of the refurbished Torii gates. We are waiting to "git-erdone" and hopefully that is before the end of September.
- 2.) Work continues on the repairs to the north fence panels.
- 3.) Due to the extremely low water levels in the pond the JMG volunteers are investigating ways of:
 - a. Two pits have been dug in the pond to hold the pumps at a deeper level. We are hoping that this will allow us to run the pumps for longer even if the water levels drop to extreme low levels. Concrete pads were placed in both pits to support the pumps.
 - b. Discussions are underway with GFL Environmental to determine the best way to pump the muck out of the pond.
