7. RV and Tiny Home on Wheels Final Report

Tiny homes on wheels are already being used within the SGIs and developing appropriate standards for use, without jeopardizing housing security of current occupants, will allow these types of dwellings to play a role in combating the housing crisis. This report provides more evidence in support of alternative housing solutions on the SGIs.
