## **Outreach Summary on First Nations Inclusion in CRD Governance**

The Board received a report summarizing outreach efforts and feedback received from regional First Nations on the CRD's proposed model for inclusive governance. The Board approved an amendment to the CRD Board Procedures Bylaw No. 4368 and an amendment to the Terms of Reference for all CRD standing committees to allow for First Nation Member participation. This effort to facilitate increased participation of First Nations in CRD governance is an important and measurable step towards the Board priority of First Nations Reconciliation and in working toward strong relationships with First Nations based on trust and mutual respect, partnerships and working together on shared goals.

# Amendment to CRD Board Remuneration and Travel Expense Reimbursement Policy to Include First Nation Members

The Board approved an amendment to the CRD Board Remuneration and Travel Expense Reimbursement Policy to support remuneration and reimbursement of First Nation Members when they participate on CRD standing committees. This allows the CRD to appropriately compensate First Nation Members for their time and expertise as well as acknowledge their important responsibilities as representative government

within their communities. This will play an important role in supporting the first steps towards more inclusive governance.

#### **Connected Coast Proposal for the Southern Gulf Islands**

Connected Coast is a backbone fibre project that will bring high speed internet accessibility to rural and remote communities along the BC coast. The Board approved a letter of support for the Connected Coast project to secure all necessary permits to bring much needed broadband solutions to the Southern Gulf Islands. The Board also resolved to support grant applications for over 25 million dollars in federal and provincial funding to support last mile fibre to the home projects on Mayne, Galiano, Saturna and North Pender Islands. If the applications are successful, a 10% contribution in kind will be provided by the communities to be served by last mile projects, subject to successful service establishment and voter assent, and to mutual agreement to the terms of any required partnership agreements.
