# Repeal of Core Area Wastewater Treatment Project Delegation and Related Delegation Bylaw Amendments

As the Wastewater Treatment Project Board has fulfilled its mandate, the CRD no longer requires specific Project-related delegations of authority. At the same time, the CRD's other delegation bylaws require minor modifications to clarify delegated authority issues that have arisen since 2017, and to ensure consistency with practice as the infrastructure and service will be managed under the CRD's existing operational structures. At a special meeting on May 26, the CRD Board read the following bylaws a

first, second, and third time and adopted them: Bylaw No. 4348, Bylaw No. 4429, and Bylaw No. 4428.

# **Annual Drinking Water Quality Report**

The water quality monitoring program remains an essential component in the delivery of a safe drinking water supply to the region. Monitoring results summarized in the Greater Victoria Drinking Water Quality – 2020 Annual Report indicate good water quality overall with the low risks associated with the unfiltered source water being well managed by the CRD multi-barrier approach. The Annual Drinking water report was approved by the Board and will be submitted to Island Health, as per requirement under the BC Drinking Water Protection Act.

## **First Nations Cultural Honorarium Policy**

The First Nations Honorarium Policy provides guidance to staff on the process for paying honoraria to First Nations when sharing traditional knowledge or participating in cultural activities. It builds on work the First Nations Relations Division has been initiating over the last number of years and rolls it out across the CRD in a consistent and effective way, with a standardized practice that will enhance financial tracking when honoraria are paid. The key outcomes from this type of approach include greater clarity for CRD staff and First Nations as to how First Nations can be recognized for their voluntary contributions to CRD projects and events as well as enhanced CRD staff competency when looking to invite First Nations into ceremonial or cultural work.
