Capital Regional District 2025 Provisional Financial Plan Approval

The Capital Regional District (CRD) Board approved its 2025 Provisional Financial Plan at a special Board meeting on October 30, 2024. The CRD, Capital Regional Hospital District (CRHD) and Capital Region Housing Corporation (CRHC) financial plans combine to form a consolidated budget totalling \$873 million. The Board directed and Board endorsed initiatives were also approved as were recommendations from the Electoral Areas Committee. These initiatives will be incorporated into the final budget, subject to successful service establishment where required. The 2025 Provisional Financial Plan is subject to change prior to final approval by the Board in March 2025 and is now available for public review and comment.

The primary cost driver for the development of the CRHD Provisional Budget is the 10-year capital plan which captures projects identified by Island Health and incorporates CRHD identified capital initiatives. The 2025 CRHD Provisional Budget is subject to change prior to final approval by the CRHD Board in March 2025.

Water Safety Pilot Program at Thetis Lake and Elk/Beaver Lake Regional Parks - Summer 2024 Update

In the summer of 2024, the Capital Regional District (CRD) Board directed staff to implement a pilot program to provide personal floatation devices and life rings at Thetis Lake (Main Beach) and Elk Lake (Hamsterly Beach) and report back after one season of implementation. PFDs and life rings were installed at the two popular beaches for a period of 11 weeks, from July 12 to September 30, 2024. Staff have completed the pilot program and assessed the implications and impacts. The CRD Board directed staff to continue the Water Safety Program at Elk/Beaver Lake Regional Park and Thetis Lake Regional Park for the foreseeable future.

AAP Requirements for Bylaw No. 4602 - Foodlands Access Service Establishment Bylaw No. 1, 2024

The CRD Board previously approved obtaining participating area approval by regional alternative approval process (AAP) for the Foodlands Access Service Establishment Bylaw to establish a new regional service for the purpose of coordinating preservation and access to farmland for agricultural use, and to promote regional food security. With an AAP, the Board may proceed with adopting the bylaw unless more than 10% of electors submit a response form to the CRD indicating that they are opposed to the establishment of the new service. The total number of registered electors within the Foodlands Access service area is 331,937 and 10% of that number is 33,194 electors. The CRD Board has approved the synopsis of Bylaw 4602, the Notice of Alternative Approval Process, and the Elector Response Form. The Board also confirmed that electoral response under this process must be submitted by qualified electors within the CRD by January 15, 2025. The current Canada Post service disruption is impacting the delivery of mail to the CRD.
