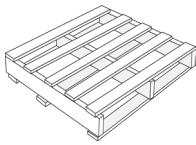


### Accepted - Separated Materials

Materials must be brought separated from each other and general refuse, including renovation and demolition material. These streams must maintain a high level of purity, ensuring they meet the acceptance criteria for waste diversion and recycling, and don't damage processing equipment.

#### Clean Wood - \$80/tonne



Wood that is untreated, unstained and unpainted.

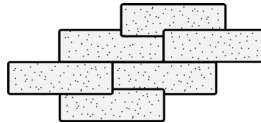
Examples:

- pallets/skids
- crating
- dimensional lumber and offcuts

#### Notes

- NO branches and trees. These must be recycled with yard and garden waste.

#### Asphalt Shingles - \$110/tonne



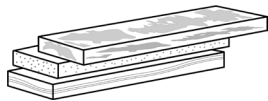
Shingles composed of a felt mat saturated with asphalt to which small rock granules are added.

Tar paper/felt paper can be mixed with loads of asphalt shingles.

#### Notes

- This material category does not include tar and gravel roofing.
- NO metal. Please remove metal flashing, vents, etc. and recycle them separately.
- NO plastic wrapping.
- If coming from a demolition or if multiple layers of asphalt shingles are present, then pre-approval or a permit must be issued before disposal. More info at [www.crd.bc.ca/renowaste](http://www.crd.bc.ca/renowaste).

#### Treated Wood and Wood Products - \$110/tonne



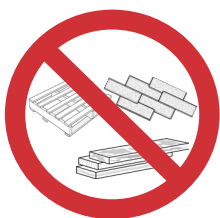
Wood consisting of engineered wood products or pressure treated, stained, or painted wood. Small nails and fasteners are ok. Metal hardware such as joist hangers, door hinges, pull handles, door knobs/locks as well as drawer slides/guides aren't allowed.

Examples:

- pressure treated
- stained
- painted
- wood composite
- medium density fiberboard (MDF)
- particle board
- plywood
- laminated wood
- laminated countertops, including Arborite
- wooden furniture (e.g., bookcases and desks, tables, chairs)
- wooden cupboards
- cedar shingles

#### Notes

- NO vinyl plank flooring.
- NO creosoted timbers. These can be disposed of at the landfill and must be separated from general refuse and be less than 8' long.
- If coming from a demolition or renovation pre-approval or a permit must be issued before disposal. More info at [www.crd.bc.ca/renowaste](http://www.crd.bc.ca/renowaste).



### Not Accepted - Comingled or Banned Materials

Loads containing comingled materials (wood and asphalt shingles mixed together) and/or banned materials are subject to a fine up to \$500. Please take comingled materials to a waste transfer station for drop off and sorting.

Examples of common banned materials include concrete, rocks, and large pieces of metal (kitchen sinks, rebar, threaded rod, etc.).
