- 3. Direct staff to balance the 2022 actual revenue and expense on the transfer to capital reserve fund.







Saanich Peninsula Liquid Waste Management Plan



- Liquid Waste Management Plan for Central Saanich, North Saanich & Sidney – established in 1996
- Plan Commitments CRD & Municipal Commitments:
  - Source Control Program
  - Inflow & Infiltration Reduction Program
  - Wastewater & Marine Assessment Program
  - Wastewater Treatment & Residuals Management
  - On-site Septic System & Septage Collection
  - Water Conservation & Wastewater Recycling
  - Stormwater Quality Program



# System Infrastructure

- Total length of wastewater collection & conveyance (gravity & pressure) mains across system: 16.1 km
- Pipe diameters range from 300mm-750mm; late 1990s construction
- Pipe material types:

Concrete 10% Steel 10% PVC 73%  $\mathsf{AC}$ 7%

- 3 Pumping Stations
- 67 manholes

Municipal Boundary Ocean / Lake

River / Stream Major Road

- Secondary Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Bazan Bay Ocean Outfall: 1.5 km




### Peninsula Treatment Plant Facts

- Activated Sludge Secondary Treatment Plant
- Treatment Plant Average Dry Weather Flow Capacity: 18,500 m3/day
- Treatment Plant Peak Day Flow Capacity: 41,000 m3/day
- Current Population Equivalent Served: 44,000 people (estimated)
   (225 l/person/day)
- Currently the SPWWTP is operating at 54% and 70% of design ADF & PDF flows.
- Discharge Permit Effluent Quality Criteria:
  - Biochemical Oxygen Demand 45 mg/l
     Total Suspended Solids 45 mg/l
     Provincial Operational Certificate ME-15445



# Plant Process Flow Diagram






# Residuals Management



- Plant Produces 4,100 metric tons/year of Raw Sludge
- Plant Equipped to Produce Class A Biosolids
  - Sludge is heat pasteurized and lime stabilized to produce Class A Biosolids regulated by BC OMRR
  - 'PenGrow' product produced between 2006-2010
  - Production and distribution halted in 2011 CRD Board decision to ban production and distribution at regional facilities of Biosolids intended for land application
  - Currently land filled as controlled waste
- District Energy System SPWWTP Heat Recovery System
  - System in service since 2011
  - Initial capital investment of \$2.99M UBCM General Strategic Priorities Fund (Gas Tax Agreement Funds); 100% grant funding as pilot project
  - Capturing waste heat energy utilized by Panorama Recreation Centre



# **Service Budget**

- Operating & Capital Budgets
  - Provides for all expenditures for Operation & Maintenance (0&M), administration of wastewater service and capital projects
- Operating, Capital Project Lists & Supplemental budget items considered by Commission annually in September for recommendation to CRD Board
- Service Funding
  - 100% of annual operating costs funded by requisition to participants based on flow (with exception of revenue generated from sale of heat energy from DES)
  - Participants: Central Saanich, North Saanich, Sidney, Airport, Pauquachin FN, Tseycum FN, IOS
  - 100% of debt costs funded by requisition to participants calculated by capacity formula
  - Development Cost Charge Capital (DCC) primarily funded through collection of DCC funds
